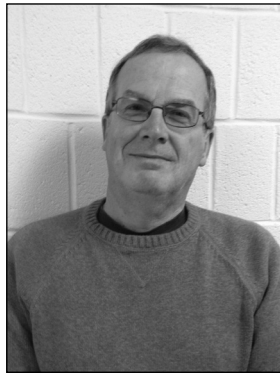

Caro man leaves more than \$100,000 to TCC Foundation

The Tuscola County Community Foundation often is left funds from community members after they die.

But what Richard Rokita did upon his passing was unprecedented.

Rokita, a Detroit native who lived in Caro from 1995 until passing away in June, left TCCF just over \$100,000.

“It’s a first since I’ve been with the community foundation,” said TCCF Executive Director Ken Micklash. “We’ve received wonderful gifts from many individuals, but to leave a gift of that size, not even in his name, is a first of its kind.”

Rokita died on June 4 at age 60 after a five-year battle with cancer.

The Beginning

In November of 1996, nine community-minded volunteers, Richard Ransford, Robert Tuckey, Susan Walker, Sue Ransford, Harry Schubel, Richard Donahue, Linda Marshall, Richard Kern, and L. James White, from the Caro and Cass City areas met to determine the requirements to establish a community foundation. Part of their motivation was the challenge issued by the W.K. Kellogg Foundation to match \$1.00 (up to \$1,000,000) for every \$2.00 raised by community foundations. To meet the requirements, a grant application had to be submitted by April 1, 1997 and a Youth Advisory Committee (YAC) had to be established.

Through the diligent efforts of these volunteers along with help provided by the Council of Michigan Foundations, the Huron County Community Foundation and many others, all requirements for establishing a

community foundation as well as the application for the Kellogg grant were completed by deadline. After a period of discussions, in early 1998, the trustees of the William A. and Ruth Janks Foundation and Claude D. and Etta H. Andrews Foundation agreed to terminate their private foundation status and become part of the new Tuscola County Community Foundation (TCCF).

With all the requirements fulfilled, a Challenge Youth Project Grant from the W. K. Kellogg Foundation was received by the TCCF in two installments - \$900,000 in November of 1998 and \$100,000 in August of 1999. The first YAC grants were awarded in September of 1999. Since the TCCF inception, grants and scholarships awarded in Tuscola County from the over 90 various funds have surpassed \$4.5 million.

HAAS, CURTIS AND VARNEY

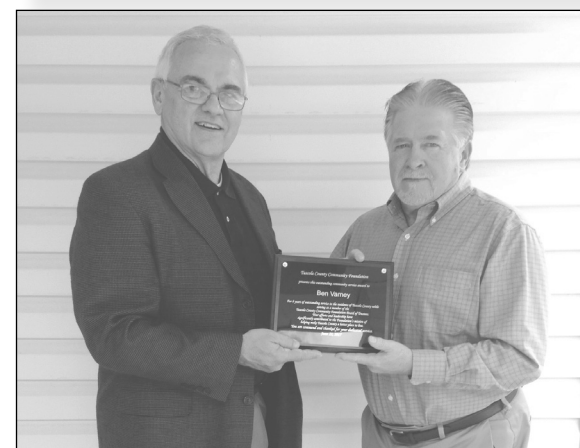
Gary Haas of Mayville, Pat Curtis of Caro and Ben Varney of Cass City were recently recognized for their many years of dedicated service as Board of Trustee members for the Tuscola County Community Foundation. All voluntarily served for 8 years. Haas served the majority of his years as president of the Board. During their period of service they all helped develop policies and procedures for the operation of the Tuscola County Community Foundation and saw assets grow from \$6 million to over \$12 million. Over 90 funds are now maintained by the Foundation and over \$4.5 million has been awarded in grants and scholarships helping achieve the mission of the Foundation, “To help make Tuscola County a better place to live.”

Funds for Operations

All organizations, including those that are charitable, require funding in order to operate. It is not unusual for operating fees to be in the area of 5 to 15% for some charitable organizations. The Tuscola County Community Foundation also needs financial resources in order to fulfill its responsibilities of maintaining the 90 plus funds entrusted to it.

Less than one (1)%, or less than one (1) penny on a dollar of the funds managed within the Tuscola County Community Foundation is needed for operating purposes. In 2017, .67%, or less than 1%, was the fee needed to cover operational expenses. For every one dollar donated to the Tuscola County Community Foundation more than .99 cents of it stays within our county or region to help with our mission which is to help implement dreams and efforts to become realities. Additionally, new funds, during the first partial year of existence and the next two (2) complete years are not assessed any fee for operations. This is done to assist with new fund growth and development. The average administrative fee for community foundations in Michigan is in the two (2)% range.

The all-volunteer Board of Trustees of the Tuscola County Community Foundation work diligently to control costs in order to maintain a very low operating fee structure.

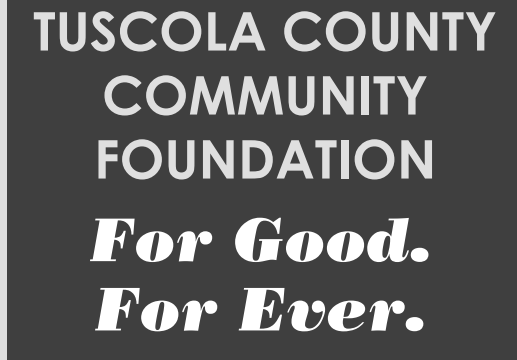
